

You are welcome to walk around **St Aiden's chapel**.

Aiden was a 7th century monk and missionary, from Lindisfarne Island. Aidan trained Chad, later Bishop of Lichfield, after whom this church is named.

There is always a gentle sense of peace, here. The Sanctuary is dominated by a modern rood beam; you will see on it a carved text "God so loved the world". God's love is all embracing, forgiving and non-judgmental and because of it we are able to have a relationship with God and experience his love directly.

Originally used as a vestry it was extended as a chapel in memory of a past incumbent, the Revd R.E.St.Aubin Arkwright (1906 – 1913).

In 1951 it was refurbished as the memorial chapel of the King's Shropshire Light Infantry and the Hereford Regiment. The Regimental Colours have been laid up in the chapel since 1952; have a look at the flags and memorials — there is a lot of history on the walls. The regimental motto 'Aucto splendore resurgo' translates as 'I shall rise with added splendour'.

Morning prayer is said here during the week, and the Blessed Sacrament is reserved for the sick and dying.

A prayer: Lord Jesus, Lamb of God, please be near me now. I ask you to lead me forward into a stronger faith. May I know your peace. Amen
